MSMEs & IPR

The Micro Small and Medium (MSMEs) are appropriately regarded as the backbone of Indian economy. The sector comprises of 26 million enterprises providing employment to 60 million people and it is second largest employer after agriculture. MSMEs are often the driving force behind innovations. Their innovative and creative capacity, however, is not always fully exploited as many SMEs are not aware of the intellectual property system or the protection it can provide for their inventions, brands, and designs.

To address this issue and to give impetus to manufacturing, the Central Government formulated a National Manufacturing Competitiveness Programme (NMCP) in 2006. One of the important components of the programme focuses on assisting MSMEs to have access to best practices for identification, protection and management of IPR as a business tool.

NIESBUD-IPFC

The National Institute for Entrepreneurship & Small Business Development (NIESBUD), the apex training Institute of Govt. of India, has set up an Intellectual Property Facilitation Centre (IPFC) at its Campus, Noida district Gautam Budh Nagar, U.P. The centre is sponsored by the Office of the Development Commissioner (MSMEs), Ministry of MSME, Govt of India.

IPFC's mandate

- Raising IPR awareness levels amongst MSMEs helping them to integrate IP in their businesses
- Facilitating legal protection through IP, filing applications for IPRs
- Facilitating support so that effective utilization of IPR tools leads to technology upgradation and enhanced competitiveness

The MSME Development Act, 2006

The Act became operational on 2 October, 2006. This provides for the first ever legal framework for recognition of the concept of enterprise i.e. manufacturing and service enterprises, along with three tier classification i.e. Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises.
